



#### Teen show—The Mouse That Roared



Auditions are September 16-17. Show is Nov 30-Dec 1, Dec 5-7, Dec 12-14 Summary of the show: In our American culture It's a Wonderful Life has become almost as familiar as Dickens' A Christmas Carol. The story is a natural for a stage adaptation: the saga of George Bailey, the Everyman from the small town of Bedford Falls, whose dreams of escape and adventure have been quashed by family obligation and civic duty, whose guardian angel has to descend on Christmas Eve to save him from despair and to remind him—by showing him what the world would have been like had he never been born—that his has been, after all, a wonderful life. This faithful adaptation has all your favorite characters: George and Mary Hatch, Clarence, Uncle Billy, Violet, and, of course, the Scrooge-like villain, Mr. Potter. And a very special thanks to The Dutch Village for once again co-hosting this event! We couldn't have done this without Joe, Veronica and all of their cast and crew!!!
































## **Annual Membership Meeting**

As we approach our 60th Season producing live theater for Holland and West Michigan, we take time to look back over the years and remember those who saw a need for live theatre in Holland and helped create the Holland Community Theatre. We share fond memories of those that have left us. And we also think about the people, who are still present and active in many ways - sharing their talent and passion for theater- onstage and off. Whether they are backstage, sitting on committees, in the audience, or helping out financially; our theater family is alive and well.

The surviving members who started with us in the 60's (and the list is longer than we you would think) includes Phil Sturdevant, Esther Van Ark, Marilyn Matula, John Ozinga, Nancy Gasper & Sandy Young. They joined in and put on plays for the sheer joy of creating them and continue to support our mission for the past 55 to 60 years. Sadly, this past year we lost 4 of those veterans - Gordon Cunningham, Mary Van Langevelde, Dennis Hamilton, and Dick Williams.

In the 1970's came Jack Oonk, Phil Plomp, Brian Everitt and Deane Williams. During the 80's, we were joined by Bill McAndrew, Marie Hamilton, Darlene Kolean, Jodi Miller, Gail Hering, Alan Hering, David Hering, Laurie Van Ark and many more that are no longer living in the Holland area.

Our first 30 years, from 1960-61 (our first full season) thru 1989, we shared the Holland High stage. We produced 129 productions for over 140,000 audience members. During the next 4 seasons, we produced our shows for Tulip Time visitors and served them dinner at the West Ottawa Performing Arts Center.

For the last 30 years, we have been producing shows for our audiences on our own stage at 50 W 9th St. Since the 1989-90 season, we have produced 177 for thousands of audience members

As we begin our next 30 years serving Holland, we turn our thoughts to the future and towards bringing a true community Performing Arts Center to our city. We look forward to many more years serving the greater Holland/West Michigan area by providing live theatre for the enrichment and education of our community. We have a proud heritage!

Help us next year as we celebrate our 60<sup>th</sup> year producing wonderful live theatre!!!
